Dear Friends

As I write this letter, the sun is shining but the weather presenters forecast a cold snap and possibly snow showers later this week. We're only just getting used to it being Autumn! I laugh, but find it shocking that the weeks go by so quickly, without us seemingly being aware of it.

In this edition, you will find lots of news about activities taking place across the Circuit to celebrate Christmas. Please also check the Circuit Plan for our special services, as we share together in worshipping and re-living the story of Jesus coming into the world as a baby. The Bible readings throughout Advent help us to prepare ourselves and reflect on receiving Christ into our hearts, minds, and lives. They also point us to being alert and watchful for Christ's second coming into the world.

I'm mindful of the Church's liturgical calendar year, which goes through a 3-yearly cycle, and we are now in Year A, when everything begins again. The readings turn to the gospel according to Matthew and in particular chapters 24 (v 36-44), 3 (1-12), 11 (2-11) and 1 (18-25), in that order throughout Advent – don't they jump about a bit?

The first urges us to be awake and ready for the unexpected coming of Jesus – who knows when that would be? There is a sense of urgency and expectancy at God's future.

The second is the story of John the Baptist pointing the way to Jesus, preparing the way. How do we prepare ourselves? What do we need to repent of? There is an urgency in repentance.

In the third reading, Jesus is doing something that John didn't expect (read it to find out what). Jesus sets an example of the mission that God wants us to be involved in. It may not be what we were expecting, but it will be with God's blessing. Perhaps we can reflect on this a bit further, as we consider our Circuit 5 year Plan?

The fourth reading takes us into Joseph's story of the birth of Jesus. Matthew sets the scene for the rest of his account; how special Jesus is, fulfilling earlier prophecies of the Messiah (Isaiah 7: 14, which he quotes in verse 23). "Emmanuel" – God is with us!

In Advent the Church takes notice of where God is doing justice, peace, and well-being. God promises us 'something new'. Are we aware and watching? God's story is our story. Are we ready to accept it with joy at Christmas?

Whatever you are doing this season, please find time to spend it with God, and reflect on the readings that you will be hearing each week. What is God saying to you?

Have a contemplative Advent, and a Happy Christmas!

Hannah Wilson (Member of Wetherby Methodist Church)

My name is Hannah and I am from Leeds. I have just finished my undergraduate degree in BA Sociology at the University of York. I will be serving on a Stride placement in Salta, Argentina, from January to July 2026.

I felt led to take part in Stride because of my family's deep connection and love for Latin America, where they have served in the past. As a Sociology graduate, I'm passionate about meeting and understanding people, exploring different cultures and finding meaningful ways to help and support communities. This opportunity feels like a natural way to bring those passions together, alongside deepening my relationship with God and sharing his love with others.

I will be serving alongside the team at San Andrés Church, with a focus on supporting a church planting project in the west of Salta. This area is home to many families' facing economic hardship, including single mothers and blended households. I'll be involved in a range of weekly outreach activities including a Saturday kids' club, women's gym classes and midweek gatherings, all with the aim of fostering trust, meeting practical needs, and providing a visible, caring presence in the community. Beyond this, I'll contribute to a twice-weekly food outreach programme that serves meals to the homeless community. I'll assist with preparing and serving food, help facilitating the space and spending time with people, offering care and meaningful conversation.

During the July winter break, when city-based activities pause, I'll have the opportunity to support short-term mission work among rural indigenous communities, helping with the children's programme and itinerant training seminars.

If you're in a position to give financially, I would be so grateful. Your support will go towards key costs such as flights, vaccines, a visa, living expenses, and accommodation. 



As some of you will know, the past few years have brought a number of health frustrations for me following some unexpected faints in January 2023. These have prompted ongoing reflection about sustainability and well-being.

Earlier this month I met with Occupational Health. Together we concluded that, for the sake of my long-term health, it would be wise for me to move into a part-time role in the next season of ministry.
