'Jesus is Lord!'

Around me, people are tidying their gardens, trimming hedges, and mowing lawns. I'm one of them – in fact, I've just broken my hedge trimmer. I don't think the cable was very safe, so I've had to buy a new one, a cordless one this time (as I've cut through the other twice!). The new one is extendable and has got many uses, which will help me to carry out the tasks that need doing in the garden.

Recently, it's been Pentecost Sunday, followed by Trinity Sunday, and I've been thinking about the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Paul writes about them in 1 Corinthians 12: 1-31. Corinth was a diverse community, and Paul had a hard time in proclaiming the Good News of Jesus. But within all that, amazing things were happening in the works of the Spirit and the new Church, being full of excitement and enthusiasm, was able to cry 'Jesus is Lord'.

We may have enthusiasm for our local church, and the unity of the Circuit; we also need the right equipment / resources to carry out our tasks. As we read Paul's writing in the passage mentioned above, we can relate the gifts of the Spirit to our friends around us; to those who serve in many ways in our churches and in a wider role among the Circuit.

There are many differing gifts and differing functions, as Paul says, given by God to be used in God's service. They are to build up the church, in unity, to God's glory. Every small thing that we do in our churches is for the benefit of all.

We love God and want to live our lives for him, and it is this gift of Faith which turns our visions into action.

In the body of Christ, we each have a part to play, and no task is insignificant or more important than another. You have a valued contribution to make, because not one person can fulfil all the roles. Sometimes the roles we do apply to our strengths, and at other times they're outside our comfort zones — which reminds me of the Covenant Prayer in the Methodist Worship Book page 288.

We are reminded in John 14: 26 that God the Father sends the Holy Spirit in Jesus' name: God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit are all co-present. Whatever your special gift might be, your tasks within the Church, remember that you are resourced by the Holy Spirit, God is with you. Let the Spirit be poured out upon you and be encouraged in what you do. With thanks and prayers for each one of you.

Circuit Service 29 June at Wetherby

According to the Conference Programme, the service starts at 10.45am. Please arrive by 10.30am and we will begin with refreshments, and be ready for the 10.45am start. As the service starts later than your usual services, please do feel free to come and go as you wish.

I have made enquiries about the Ordination Service at 4pm but haven't yet had any reply. Let's assume that the service will not be live-streamed, but if it is I'll circulate a note around the Stewards, and we will live-stream that too at Wetherby.

Please note that 29 June is also Drovers Day in Wetherby, with marching bands congregating on Bank Street (where the church is) to march down to the Riverside Car Park (which will not be in use to the public). Bank Street will be CLOSED FROM 12 NOON TO 4PM which includes access to and from our church car park. The car parks at Crossley Street, Morrisons (2 hours), and the Old Station Car Park will be open, if you wish to park there.

We know that this isn't ideal (but we can't do anything about it), so another alternative is, if you are unable or unsure about coming through to Wetherby, you should be able to watch the service on your internet. When the live-streaming is 'live' it will appear on the Conference page with the link shown below, or you may be able to find it on YouTube under 'Methodist Church of Britain'. At least, we will know that we will be watching it together!
