The Ripple Effect

All that was calm and still, now is disturbed.

Do we ever think about the things we do and say, and how they have the rippling effect which can go on and on, disturbing all those who are around, in one way or another? When we are kind, we inspire others to be kind and it creates a ripple which affects others and encourages them to be kind too.

In the Bible the 'Battle of Jericho' ranks as one of the most significant turning points in Jewish history. This victory came about because of one act of kindness by a woman who would normally be of no significance and disregarded in society. Who am I referring to? Rahab.

Following the death of Moses, Joshua is appointed by God to lead the children of Israel into the Promised Land. Although Joshua is a man of faith, he is also a military man of strategy. Before he sets out to invade Canaan, he sends two of his men into the city of Jericho to spy out the land. Joshua wanted an up-to-date account of the inhabitants and the defences that were surrounding the city of Jericho. Whilst there, the two spies stayed in the house of Rahab, a prostitute.

It wasn't long before the king of Jericho found out about the men staying in Rahab's house and that they were spies. He wanted to see them and sends men to Rahab's house. Rahab admits they had stayed with her but says they had already left. The men set off in pursuit of the spies. However, Rahab had hidden the two men on the roof of her house, under some stalks of flax she had put up there.

In return for her hiding the men, Rahab asks for a favour. She pleads with them to promise to show kindness to her and her family, and save them from death. The two men promised they would. Rahab helps the men to escape and then, in time when the city is attacked, Rahab and her family are saved. It is an interesting story and can be found in Joshua Ch 2.

However, there is more to tell about Rahab. According to Jewish tradition Rahab is considered a beautiful woman and converted to Judaism at the age of fifty. She fell in love with Salmon, a Jewish man from the tribe of Judah. They had a son named Boaz, who had a son named Obed, who had a son named Jesse, who had a son named David – the shepherd boy who became King David.

When it comes to the ripple effect of showing kindness, which can affect lives for generations to come, Rahab, this biblical heroine, is a brilliant example. Her kindness in hiding the spies, and their kindness in return, meant she was not only King David's great-great-grandmother she also features in the genealogy of Jesus!

As my time comes to an end as Local Pastor in the Tadcaster Circuit, I have appreciated the acts of kindness members and friends have shown to me (and Charlie). You will never be forgotten. Thank you. So, may God bless you as you show acts of kindness to those around. You never know, the ripple effect could reach many lives for generations to come.

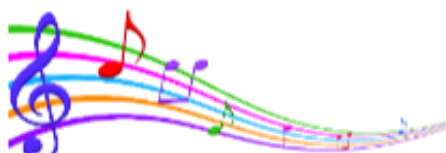
